This week at Priory

Firstly, I'd like to commend all parents for your resilience and determination over the last few weeks as we've battled the elements during drop-off and collection. The torrential rain seems relentless, and while I promise I haven't scheduled it to start at 8:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. each day, I know it makes everything harder! From heavier traffic to tricky parking and the general dampening of our mood, it's no small feat to stay patient. I truly appreciate the smiles and perseverance you've shown.

In response to requests from parents and local residents, Mrs. Larkins and I have been on Orchard Avenue over the last few weeks to help keep the road clear and the traffic moving. 

Our Learning

This Week:

In math, we have been looking at the vocabulary less than, more than and equal to. We introduced the symbols >, < and = to the children and spent time comparing numbers using cubes and straws. We also compared groups of objects by using the vocabulary more than and less than.

In English, we started our new text *Tree: seasons come, seasons go.* The children spent drawing and labelling a picture of tree and discussed how it would change throughout the seasons. We spent some time reading and performing the text; children enjoyed pretending to be different animals in the story.

Busy Learning:

This week, the children have completed a range of learning opportunities (set tasks) in the busy learning area. They have been looking at pictures of autumn trees and writing what they can see. In our Math area, children have used numicon to find one more and one less of a number. There has been a range of exploratory tuff trays set up in the outdoor area, including a farm to celebrate harvest festival!

Next Week's Learning:

Math: We will continue to compare numbers using the greater than, less than and equal to symbols. We will also be introducing children to Number lines. English: We will be describing a tree during the spring time using adjectives.

Science: We will be going on a nature hunt to look for signs that we are in autumn.

<u>Our Learning</u>

This week, the children have enjoyed testing the



softness of different materials in science and recording their results in their books. In maths, they've done really well at filling in the missing numbers on a number

line when counting in tens or ones. We all really enjoyed attending a live online workshop from the Henley Literary Festival on Tuesday too.

Children's author, Petr Horácek read some of his books, shared what inspired his stories and also taught the children how to draw some of the characters in his books.



Next week, we will start writing our own stories in English which will be set at the time of the Great Fire of London. In maths, we will be comparing objects and numbers using language such as 'greater than' and 'less than'. In science we will be using playdoh and other materials to explore how the shapes of some objects can change shape by: squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.

Our Learning

This week, we had the opportunity to take part in an online lesson, led by the author of 'How To Train Your Dragon-Cressida Cowell- as part of the Henley Literary Festival. We also planned a piece of independent writing inspired by the work we have been doing in English lessons so far. In Maths, we began a unit working on addition and subtraction strategies. During Science lessons the children explored rocks and soil. This included the opportunity to dig for 'fossils' and to even have a go at making one!

Next week, we will be completing some independent writing inspired by our class text, Stone Age Boy. Maths lessons will give us the opportunity to further explore addition and subtraction. During the afternoon lessons, we will begin a unit of Art where we will study ancient artists. As part of our work , we will learn how to mix colours and to use a grid to recreate works of art accurately.



<u>Our Learning</u>

This week, we began our science unit and carried out an experiment (with chocolate and cheese) to help us understand what happens to different states of matter when they are heated. We also learnt the different processes when matters change in state.

In maths, we learnt the skills to round 4-digit numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

In English, we began our new book Charlotte's Web by E.B White. We made predictions using the front cover and explored settings and characters from the story!

Next week, we will continue to study changes in states of matter. We will also carry out another experiment that will help us to understand the processes of the water cycle!

In maths, we will start a new topic of adding two 4-digit numbers with no, one and more than one exchange. We will also continue to focus on the multiplication and division facts of the 3 times tables .

In English, we will explore language devices and write a setting description of a farm. dialogue.

PSHRE Focus: Being Me in My World. In PSHRE this term, we will learn that our attitudes and actions make a difference to our class team. We will acknowledge who is in our school community, the roles they play and how we fit in. We will understand that our actions affect ourselves and others. We will learn to care about other people's feelings by trying to empathise with them.

This week, we finished our RE unit on Judaism where we made Rosh Hashanah cards.

In maths, we applied our place value knowledge to rounding increasingly large amounts. At the end of the week, we enjoyed an escape room to consolidate our learning.

In English, we celebrated Black History Month by looking at Maya Angelou's famous poem "I Rise".

Next week, we will start our history unit and write our very own inspiring wartime speeches.

<u>Our Learning</u>

This week, in DT, we planned and designed our own magic wands inspired by Harry Potter, and chose which magical materials we will make them out of. We can then use our creations on Hogwarts Day!

In English, we continued on Harry's journey and had have the chance to learn more about Quidditch and other fantastic beasts by writing an explanation text.

In maths, we continued to explore the current topic by improving our knowledge of prime, square and cube numbers followed by multiplication by 2-digit numbers.

Next week, in science, we will begin a new topic on Light. We will learn about how light travels and how our eyes see light. We will investigate how shadows are formed and how we can change the shape and size of them.

In English, we will finish our Harry Potter unit by writing our own narrative part of the story, incorporating all the incredible vocabulary we have collected over the last several weeks.

In maths, we will continue to improve our understanding of multiplication by 2-digit numbers and use this knowledge to solve worded problems. Then, we will begin to explore short division.



In English, the children have been working on their sentence formation by structuring sentences on their interests in school. The children have been choosing favourite activities, such as swimming, sensory room, lunch or messy play and then writing an 'I like...' sentence. Some children have been adding reasons to why they love that activity using the key word: because.


In Maths, the children have been working on one-to-one correspondence of numbers up to 20; as well as partitioning numbers up to 100 into hundreds, tens and ones. They have continued with completing patterns using arrange of concrete and pictorial resources; as well as, exploring the properties of 2D, and 3D shapes.

In Science, the children have continued looking at different materials and the discarding of everyday objects and packaging. We have explored the concept of recycling our rubbish and exploring each material to which bin we place them in.

In Geography, the children have been exploring the school and creating mental maps of each school area and its function. The children have taken it in turns to lead the class exploration team into finding a given destination and giving a reason to what the purpose of that specific area.
