


#### Good luck Miss O'Connor as you leave school to have your baby boy.

Focus core math skill: recognising more and less

#### This Week:

In math this week, we have been recapping a range of different concepts that we have covered this term. During busy learning the children have been finding missing numbers and have enjoyed using a range of different math resources to represent them.

In English this week, the children continued to

describe the different seasons and have become more confident in using key grammatical vocabulary such as 'subject' and 'verb'. Our classroom puppets introduced them to some new and exciting vocabulary to describe Autumn leaves. These words included: crunchy, gold and orangeybrown.

In our afternoon sessions, we continued with our art

unit on the formal elements. This week, we focused on pattern and texture and looked at a range of different art work to inspire our own. The children took inspiration from Lorna Simpson and added a range of textures to their self-portraits. They worked really hard to carefully cut out small shapes from a range of fabrics and other material.

Next Week's learning:

In Math next week we will be starting our new topic on addition and subtraction (within 10). We will be introducing children to part – whole models. In English we will be finishing our text Tree: seasons come, seasons go. We will be focusing on the final season, using a range of adjectives to describe winter.

In art, we will be finishing our unit on the formal elements focusing on shape and colour.

### <u>Our Learning</u>

This week, we have been exploring 2D shapes and thinking about how many sides and how many vertices they have. The children had fun using matchsticks to represent the different shapes. We have finished writing our stories in English and the children have impressed us with their creative ideas, great descriptions and very neat handwriting. In RE, we have been thinking about whether it is possible to be kind to everyone all of the time and have linked this to the Christian story of The Good Samaritan. The children have also been engaging in our learning opportunities in the garden this week. They particularly enjoyed a fine motor skill activity where they used tweezers to collect laminated pumpkins out of the mud tray and then draw funny faces on them!



Next week, we will continue to look at the properties of 2D shapes, investigating which shapes have a vertical line of symmetry. We are also going to re-visit our history topic of The Great Fire of London, make our own model buildings based on those built in 1666 and then watch the fire spread from house to house in a controlled re-enactment of the Great Fire! In English, we will plan and write a recount of this exciting event.



#### Our Learning

**This week,** the children have been busy making their own images using mosaics. Also, we have been looking at the rates of evaporation depending on temperature.

**In maths**, the children have been learning to add two four-digit numbers with more than one exchange and they have showed brilliant resilience.

In English, the children have been learning about spiders and then they have been creating their own summer poems based on life on a farm.

**Next week,** we will be making our final mosaic based on the children's designs and we are going to be starting our R.E topic about Judaism.

In **maths**, we will be learning how to subtract numbers using the column method.

**In English,** we will continue reading Charlotte's Web and will kick start the term by writing our own Kenning-style poetry about Charlotte the spider.

## <u>Our Learning</u>

This week, we enjoyed performing our sharing assembly for parents!

In maths, we continued to practise using column method addition and subtraction in a range of contexts.

#### Y6 science: periscopes



#### <u>Our Learning</u>

This week, in science, we continued learning about light and how the eye works. We looked at how light is refracted (or bent) in water, as well as through a prism to separate white light into rainbows.

In English, we finished our Harry Potter unit by writing our own narrative part of the story, incorporating all the incredible vocabulary we collected over the last several weeks.

In maths, we consolidated the strategies of long division. We used our knowledge to solve multi-step problems.

Next week, in science, we will start a unit on electricity. We will learn how to use scientific circuit diagrams with symbols, about the hazards of electricity and have a go at making and testing our own circuits.

In English, we will sit our Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar test. We will also have the chance to finally watch Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone!

In maths, we will sit our maths reasoning test . In the last lesson of the week , we will explore how to use order of operations to solve mathematical problems.

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## Peek at the Week

The Woodlands Week commencing- 14.10.24

#### What the Woodlands has been up to

#### This week:

Woodlands children have been further exploring their new topics and the new items we have had delivered.

In English, one group started to write their independent sentences about the introduction and middle of the story of Stone Age Boy. The children have shown great use of synonyms and adjectives, to enhance their work.

Another group has started to write independent sentences about 'Rose Blanche', emphasising the rising tension into the middle of the story. The children are showing pride in their work and putting in the effort.

In Maths, our focus has been on number lines. We have explored how to fill in missing numbers on a number line and counting forwards and backwards. The children have really enjoyed developing their number skills.

The children have also continued to develop their writing of numerals in words and improving their counting skills.

**The afternoon**, we have continued to develop our turn-taking skills and self regulation.

The children have explored the new items in the Woodlands calm room. The children have shown good turn-taking skills and independently overcome interpersonal issues.

#### Next week,

In English, we are going to continue our independent writing of the middle of the story and into the end.

In Maths, we are going to further explore number lines and consolidate our understanding of what we have covered so far.

The afternoon children are going to continue their work on self regulation and social skills.





## The Orchard–Peek of the Week Week commencing: 14/10/2024

## <u>Our Learning</u>

In English this week, Cherry and Plum class, have recalled the events of the topic book and have ordered the events with visual support.

In Apples and Pear class the children have been using different materials to make a potion following simple step instructions. They have been pouring slime and mixing the potion. They then completed their sentence by choosing the correct noun bat, spider, slime and pumpkin seeds. They have had great fun exploring the materials.

In Maths, Apple and Pear class have been singing the Halloween song' What's that sound?' to support with their counting and ordering skills. They have also been copying and completing simple patterns using numicon, cubes and teddies and sorting/matching 2D shapes.

Cherry and Plums have been adding and subtracting numbers up to 20, sorting/ identifying 2D shapes and completing a simple shape/ complex pattern using resources found in classroom.

In Art this week the children have been creating their own natural art using a range of natural resources to make patterns and faces with templates. They first made a list with visual support.
