Communication & Language

This week in phonics we have looked at **y**, **qu** and ch. We have also seen how a 's' can be added to the end of words. We have continued to encourage the children to blend decodable words, such as "chip' 'buzz' and 'yet'. The phonics sheet inside your child's home learning journal has some familiar words which you can practice blending together at home.

We have also been learning lots of new tricky words this week in phonics. These are words which cannot be sounded using phonetical knowledge, as they do not make the taught sounds. We teach the children to recognise and read tricky words by sight. Please practice the tricky words: **as, has, and, put, pull, his and her.**



Our Learning

This week:

In math, we continued to practicing numbers within 10. The children have used number lines and part whole models to find missing numbers.

In English, we begun reading our new class text: Jesus's Christmas party. The children used what they could see on the front cover to make a prediction about what they thought was going to happen in the text.

In afternoon sessions this week, we started our R.E unit on Christianity. Together, we looked at the creation story and the different things that were created on each day.

child every day and discuss what you are reading. Once the children have used their phonics to decode the words in the book, please re-read the book several times over the week to help them build up their pace and fluency.


Spellings are sent home on Fridays with a spelling quiz the following Friday. Please practice writing these spellings daily if possible.

<u>Our Learning</u>

This week, we have finished our maths unit on addition and have started looking at subtraction. We used counters to represent the big number then took some away (to represent the small number) and counted how many were left. In English, we wrote up our postcards from Anna Hibiscus and started thinking about descriptive phrases to



describe what Anna can see and hear in the city, ready for our poems next week. In the garden, we made pasta snakes, which helped us work on our fine motor skills and create

repeating patterns. We also enjoyed writing our own postcards



and posting them to our friends!



Next week, we will be having a visitor from a local church, come and talk to us about the Christian Christmas story. This will complement our RE lessons where we will be learning about

and reflecting on the Christmas story and why Christians celebrate Jesus' birth.

In maths, we will continue with subtraction, drawing dots for the big number and then crossing some out (to represent the smaller number) as well as counting back in 1s on our fingers and on a blank number line.

In English we will be using our descriptive phrases to write a poem about Anna's journey from the city to the rainforest.

<u>Our Learning</u>



<u>Our Learning</u>

This week in Maths, the children have continued to work hard on their times tables and they are now more confident at the 7, 11 and 12 times table. Please continue to practise these at home.

In the afternoons, we have been looking at the digestive system and how the organs in our body to work to support digestion,.

<u>Our Learning</u>

This week, we continued exploring Vector Drawings in ICT and Mountains, Earthquakes and Volcanoes in geography. We even used Lego, ryvetas and shaving foam to recreate earthquakes!

In maths, this week we continued our topic of fractions, but focused on mixed numbers and improper fractions. We compared, converted and ordered these to extend our learning.

In English, we researched a topic for our speech on a societal issue such as homelessness, climate change or the right to education. We will then be writing our speech independently, using planned success criteria to structure our ideas.

In PSHRE, we continued to look at cultural differences within the classroom and how we should be celebrating these differences rather than allowing them to cause conflict.

Next week, we begin our DT unit and learn a range of stitches to join and decorate fabric in order to make a Christmas stocking.

In maths, we will be adding and subtracting fraction that are less than 1 and greater than 1.

In English, we will complete Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar Assessments and a Reading Assessment. We will also write a blog in Geography where the children will talk about the impact of a tsunami.

<u>Our Learning</u>

This week, in history, we wrote a news report about the trial of King Charles I. We also learnt about William and Mary, focusing on the Bill of Rights. Finally, we explored the impact of the British Empire and discussed its pros and cons.

In English, we explored the story of Macbeth in more detail and put ourselves in the role of the characters. In maths, we continued to explore fractions, learning about fractions of an amount and finding the whole.

Next week, in art, we will finish our symbolism unit by creating a collage inspired by Elizabeth II.

We will then start a geography unit on the continents.

In English, we will explore more of Macbeth in detail, learning how to emphathise with the characters. We will also begin to look at the poem Double, Double Toil and Trouble.

In maths, we will start a new topic on measurement. We will enjoy a practical lesson on measurement and focus on converting metric measures.

PSHRE Focus: Celebrating Difference. In PSHRE this term, we will learn to accept that everyone is different and understand that there are different perceptions of 'normal'. By the end of the unit, we will know how to help someone who is being bullied and explain ways in which one person or a group can have power over others. We will learn the importance of using kind words by appreciating people for who they

are.

The Woodlands Week commencing- 02.12.24

What the Woodlands has been up to

This week:

In English,

We continued with our topic of diary entries. We have continued reading "Diary of a Christmas Elf". We have been exploring writing in first person, past tense and recognising emotions.

The children have started to plan their own diary entries using what they have learnt so far.

In maths,

We have been working on subtracting a 1 digit number from a 2 digit number and adding two digit numbers. The children have been using Base 10 to assist them with their understanding.

The children have also been counting in 5's, physically, written and verbally. The children have been recognising patterns, using hundred squares and practicing multiples of 5 with hand painting.
