

Year 1 News

In English, Year 1 have started reading The Emperor's Egg. The children cut paper and used paint to create their own Antarctica setting and generated vocabulary to describe it.

















Orchard News

This week in the Orchard, the children are about to finish our topic of Transport and our books, 'We all go travelling by' and 'The Transport Encyclopaedia'.

In English this week, Cherry class have been looking at planes and rockets. We have been discussing our experiences with planes, where have we been? Where do they take us? How do they fly? As well as labelling the features of planes. They have also looked at space rockets and compared them with planes.

Apples and Plums have been looking at emergency vehicles in our community. We have been matching the vehicles to the emergency service and exploring the features of each vehicle.

In Maths this week, Cherry class have been working on number lines within 20 and comparing numbers. They have been using their skills to estimate missing numbers, compare two amounts with practical resources and number cards. They have been applying new vocabulary to compare numbers; such as 'greater than', 'less than', 'larger' and 'smaller'.

Apples and Plums have been exploring number bonds within ten, as well as continuing with our subtraction skills of 'one less' of a number.

In addition, Orchard staff would like to say a quick thank you to the parents who were able to come last Thursday for our learning together afternoon. It was fun for us all!

This course is aimed at **birth parents/families** of children affected by trauma through adverse childhood experiences like domestic violence, family break-up, bereavement, parental mental health issues and/or substance misuse. It has attachment theory underpinning all modules. Topics covered include:

- · Impact of trauma in early childhood
- Symptoms overlap Autism/ADHD/Sensory Processing
- Attachment theory & Internal Working Models
- Managing Stress
- Understanding & managing behaviour
- Life story work
- Working effectively with schools
- · Managing the Stress of Caring

Attachment-Focussed Parenting/Caregiving

For adopters and foster carers

This course is aimed at adoptive parents and foster carers of children affected by trauma through adverse childhood experiences. It has attachment theory underpinning all topics.

It is set up for families living in Berkshire or parents/carers of Berks children. There are limited spaces for non-Berks families. 29th Feb 24 - 25th Apr 24 Topics include:

- Impact of trauma on brain & body
- Attachment theory
- Symptoms overlap with ASD/ADHD
- Avoiding and Managing Stress
- Understanding & Managing behaviour
- Life story work & answering difficult questions
- Working effectively with schools
- Secondary trauma to carers

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Bedtimes & sleep can be particularly challenging for children and young people with early life trauma and insecure attachments.

This workshop will be delivered by specialist sleep practitioners and will go through:

- Importance and science of sleep
- The reasons behind problems of night settling and night waking in children with trauma history
- Good sleep hygiene, sleep cues & effective bedtime routines
- Practical ideas around food and environment
- Managing anxiety for good sleep
- Strategies for settling your child/young person to sleep and staying asleep


