### **Orchard News**

This week in Literacy, Apples and Plums have been continuing to learn about rhymes and rhyming words about our topic book 'Rumble in the Jungle'. We have been focusing on demonstrating understanding of what we hear and read, matching words that sound the same and using our phonic knowledge to build CVC words as well as short rhyming sentences.

Cherries have been learning the terminology of nouns (names), verbs (doing words) and adjectives (describing words). The children have been writing sentences including verbs and adjectives in relation the animals in the book.







This week in Maths, Apples and Plums have continued to look at size as well as using everyday language to describe the size of objects. We have looked at small, smaller and smallest.

Cherries have also been exploring size and length, using different mathematical tools to measure classroom equipment.

Dear Parent/Carer,

You are invited to attend a workshop/coffee afternoon facilitated by the Slough Mental Health Support Team (MHST) on understanding and supporting children with low mood.

The workshops will cover the following topics:

- Who the Mental Health Support Team is and how we can help
- What do we mean by low mood?
- What to look out for in young people / signs
- How to talk to your young person and open up conversations
- Maintenance of low mood and what keeps it going
- Useful techniques and how to support a young person with low mood
- Opportunity for questions, reflections and signposting to further support and resources for low mood difficulties in children

The workshop will be on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> March 2:00-3:00pm at Priory School, in the format of a coffee afternoon with a short presentation and a chance to chat informally to the Mental Health Support team afterwards. Parents who attend will also receive a copy of the slides afterwards.
