Reception News

In Reception, we had a wonderful time exploring how things can change over time. We looked at one of our favourite snacks apples - and used some super vocabulary to describe their appearance . Like the Very Hungry Caterpillar, we took a big bite out of the apples and then made some brilliant predictions about what we thought would happen. Aadya though the apple would "turn brown and mouldy!" while Bani was very excited to see if we could attract any bugs. We set timers to go off so we could go check on the apples, and we were very eager to get a closer look at what was happening! The children wrote down their predictions and displayed some fantastic drawings. The Reception teachers were very impressed by the observational skills the children showed!









Orchard News


In Orchard this week, Apple and Plum class have been constructing sentences about jungle animals with a noun and adjective during their English lessons. They have been reading descriptive sentences about the jungle animals from our topic book and matching the information to the characters in the book. Some children have been using symbols to match the characters from the book.

In Cherry class, the children have been sequencing rhyming sentences with visuals, writing using a communication board and some children have written simple rhyming sentences using their rhyming knowledge.



In Maths, Apples and Plums have been identifying value - full, half full and empty by filling measuring beakers with sensory materials and filling bottles with coloured liquids.

In Cherry class, the children have also been learning about Mass and Volume. They have been sorting objects into heavy/light using weighing scales, creating heavy/light bowls with objects and finding the mass of an object.







Year 5 science museum visit

Y5 visited the Science Museum where we were able to see exhibits linked to science, maths and engineering. We also explored axles and how they work; we then applied this new knowledge when creating our own moveable vehicles. Here, we had to construct our own axle, chassis and electrical circuit to make our vehicle move.







A.I.M High Maths day

A group of Year 5 and 6 pupils took part in an A.I.M High Maths Day on Tuesday. The children completed a range of challenges using problem-solving skills. They investigated using cubes and played with probability. A special mention goes to James Moore for creating a formula to calculate the Growing Volumes Box Problem and to Saisha Sethi who was frequently awarded house points for clear verbal reasoning.











Brilliant Book Fair

The Travelling Book Fair came to Priory last week selling a wide selection of fantastic children's books and activities. There were so many visitors to the fair this year that lots of the titles sold out completely!

We are delighted to announce that, through book sales, we made a total of £1,919.05! The reason that this is so amazing is that, as a school, we get 60% of all our takings to spend on books to fill our incredible Enchanted Library. This means that I know have the privilege of purchasing £1,151.43 worth of new books for all the pupils of Priory to enjoy!
