### **Online Media**

We have recently had a few issues with children posting inappropriate material on social media and in some cases has resulted in the police being involved.

We have tried to educate our pupils on safe online behaviours, however, they still seem to get swept up in the momentum of a chat and then at least one child takes it too far.

Please can you reiterate these messages to your child and **monitor their phones regularly**. I cannot impress on you how serious it can become quite quickly. You may be confident in your child's behaviours and that they may be 'joking' but someone in the group is likely to be impressionable, vulnerable and could go too far.

The issues we see are usually with children in Years 5 and 6, however, if you have a child in Year 4, I want you to see this message and be ready to educate your child on online media and how to behave safely before it gets to the point we have to involve outside agencies; such as the police or prevent.

# Year 6 D.T.

This term, the children in Y6 have been learning about how to make bread in their DT lessons. This unit of work links to our study of the Maya in history as this ancient civilisation used corn flour as a staple food source. The children sampled a variety of bread products from different regions of the world and compared them. They then designed bread recipes to suit the particular flavour preferences of a number of different characters. The children were supported by our amazing kitchen staff to make their bread which they then evaluated to see if they had achieved their aims.
