





Year 6 - Science

This week, Year 6 have been learning more about the circulatory system during our Science lessons. We created diagrams to show how blood circulates and adverts to describe the different components that make up our blood. We even had a go at making some 'blood' using different objects to represent the plasma, red blood cells, white blood cells and platelets. We also learnt more about how the circulatory system transports water and nutrients around the body and the importance of eating a balanced diet. We then widened our knowledge of fruit and vegetables making fruit kebabs and tasting some more exotic options!

























Year 2—Whale Rescue!

On Monday, Year 2 re-enacted the rescue of the whale by the school children in the book: The Snail and Whale by Julia Donaldson. The children were shocked to find a note from the snail in their classes saying 'Save the Whale'. When they looked outside, there was a great, blue humpback whale stuck on Priory Beach. The children asked their adults to call the police and the fire brigade to come and help them straight away. With everyone's help to keep the whale cool it was able to swim away safely when the tide came back in! This re-enactment really helped the children retell the whale's rescue in their writing lesson the following day. Well done Year 2!

You are invited to attend a workshop/coffee afternoon facilitated by the Slough Mental Health Support Team (MHST) on understanding and supporting children with sleep hygiene. The workshops will cover the following topics:

- · Setting boundaries around bedtime

The workshop will be on Wednesday 10th May 2:00-3:00pm at Priory School, in the format of a coffee afternoon with a short presentation and a chance to chat informally to the Mental Health Support team afterwards. Parents who attend will also receive a copy of the slides afterwards.
