This week in Orchard parents were invited in for the learning together afternoon. The children had a Science lesson exploring changing states of matter. Parents joined in with the children in Bucket time and participated in 3 experiments. The children enjoyed melting chocolate in their hands, watching it change from a solid into liquid. The children loved watching the explosion when adding bicarbonate soda to vinegar watching the change from liquid to gas. They also had fun melting ice outside using salt and water.


