Orchard News



Our governor, Ruth Talbot, was also particularly impressed with the exceptional behaviour and mature attitudes demonstrated by all of our Priory pupils.
























Summer Reading Challenge 2023 - Ready, Set, Read!



The Reading Agency has teamed up with the Youth Sport Trust for a challenge celebrating play and participation. This year's theme will encourage children to engage in reading, games and sport and keep their minds and bodies active over the summer.

Children aged 4 and over can complete the challenge by enjoying six books over the summer, collecting stickers and rewards along the way. Those that finish will be awarded a medal and certificate to mark their achievement. The challenge presents reading as a fun and enjoyable activity and encourages children to become lifelong book lovers. It helps prevent the trend for reading skills to dip over the summer holidays, and enhances and supports the school's reading initiatives. The fun rewards motivate the children to progress through the challenge and it is inclusive to children of all abilities as they can choose any library books that appeal to them to count towards the challenge.

Slough Libraries will be launching the challenge on Tuesday 4th July. It's free to take part -children just need to be library members. It's quick and easy to join.

The challenge will end on 16th September, so children have plenty of time to complete.

TAKE PART IN RESEARCH

How do autistic and non-autistic children process visual information? Help us find out!



Researchers at the University of Reading are finding out how autistic children process visual information and make decisions about it, and how this compares to children without a developmental condition. The research will help us understand more about sensory processing in autism.



We are looking for children aged 6 to 14 years, who have either:

- an autism spectrum diagnosis,
 OR
- no diagnosed developmental conditions



To take part in a study looking at how they process sensory information

Children will play some fun computer games where they are asked to work out the direction of a set of moving fireflies and the way in which striped beetles are facing. Children will also do some simple language and reasoning tasks, and parents/guardians will be asked to complete some questionnaires. Families will be given a voucher as a thank-you for taking part and we will reimburse travel expenses if you come to the university.
