

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


Orchard News

During English this week, the children have been building and writing sentences using the key verbs and descriptive words. The children have been matching descriptions to the characters, as well as, applying the correct verbs that match the image of the story.

In Maths this week, the children have been exploring money and amounts. The children have been becoming familiar with the different coins and their amounts. They have been matching coins, counting amounts and using coins to exchange for desired items in class.

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Year 3–Ure Museum Trip

Year 3 step back in time in the Ure Museum at the University of Reading

Year 3 had the opportunity to become Ancient Greeks when they visited the Ure Museum as part of their learning about this civilisation. They also had the opportunity to become archaeologists by handling real artefacts from this time. Read the children's recap of this visit to find out more about the activities they participated in.

Please read these recaps written by the year 3 children:

"It was so fun to be there. The best part is when we got to hold the cups. I loved the statutes. It was the best trip I ever had, nothing could beat it and I couldn't stop giggling".

"On the way I felt devastated but when I got there it was so different than I imagined. First, a lady told us about some pots. Then we were asked to draw and describe our favourite pot. After that, we were asked to put some gloves on and feel some pots. Lastly, we sat on the steps and we went back to school".

"When we got on the mini bus I was feeling excited. When we got there we put our water bottles in a box. Then we went inside where the Greek pots were kept. We saw a man and a woman. They explained Greek pots and black and red clay. They gave us a paper and we drew our favourite Greek pot".

"I loved the trip because we got to feel artefacts and they had a mouth, hand and feet. Some felt light and some felt heavy. It was very calming. The curator was very kind and caring. She helped us in **all** different kinds of ways.

I liked the shapes and patterns on the pots. Some were black figure and some were red figure".

Victoria Stevens, Learning Coordinator at the Ure Museum said, "I hope the children enjoyed their time with us - we loved having you all here, the children were just great in how they engaged with the sessions". Very well done year 3!



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Summer Reading Challenge 2023 - Ready, Set, Read!



The Reading Agency has teamed up with the Youth Sport Trust for a challenge celebrating play and participation. This year's theme will encourage children to engage in reading, games and sport and keep their minds and bodies active over the summer.

Children aged 4 and over can complete the challenge by enjoying six books over the summer, collecting stickers and rewards along the way. Those that finish will be awarded a medal and certificate to mark their achievement. The challenge presents reading as a fun and enjoyable activity and encourages children to become lifelong book lovers. It helps prevent the trend for reading skills to dip over the summer holidays, and enhances and supports the school's reading initiatives. The fun rewards motivate the children to progress through the challenge and it is inclusive to children of all abilities as they can choose any library books that appeal to them to count towards the challenge.

Slough Libraries will be launching the challenge on Tuesday 4th July. It's free to take part -children just need to be library members. It's quick and easy to join.

The challenge will end on 16th September, so children have plenty of time to complete.
