Exceptional Circumstances leave

To ensure a fair and consistent process I do not meet with parents to discuss their requests for exceptional leave. As you can probably imagine, my diary would be busy just doing those meetings and it would not be fair on those who I could not meet in person. I do get an enormous number of requests for leave and to be honest, they tend not to be exceptional. Our children have missed too much school: I cannot authorize any time out of school. This can lead to fines, which I will also not meet with a parent to discuss. Our policy details clearly the procedure and if the absence meets the criteria for a fine, a fine will be issued. Again, to ensure fairness and equity, I do not meet with parents to discuss a fine. Therefore, if you decide to take your child out of school, it is likely not to be authorised and if it meets the Local Authority criteria, you will be fined. It is that simple and there are no exceptions.

Pupil absence

As to be expected pupil absence is creeping up, understandably. However, I am a little concerned with how much time our Year 6 pupils have already taken off; there are a significant number of children already meeting the criteria for persistent absentees.

It is such an important year for our Year 6 pupils and they have such a lot to catch up on, so please do try to dose them up and send them in! Some of these respiratory viruses do hang about for a bit and it is not realistic to keep them off for too long.

Staff Absence

It has been a tough week coping with the high absence of staff but we have got through and most are still smiling. I saw this sign somewhere and really liked it — I have also shared it with the staff and thought I would share it with you all.
