In our story Anna Hibiscus' Song, Anna's Auntie pounded yam. We had a go pounding yam and needed to use our wrist muscles to grind the yam up.

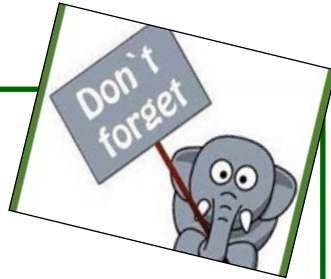


Half Term holiday is next week. We look forward to welcoming you back on **Monday 30th October**
