
Communication and Language

<u>Our Learning</u>

This week in English, we learnt about the features of a persuasive letter, so that we could draft own persuasive letters to Mrs Foster next week. In maths, we began our unit on money and have reminded ourselves of the value of different coins and what they look like. We have also been using our coins to make different amounts.

In science, we set up an experiment to test what conditions plants need to grow. We have been observing our cress seeds and were surprised to find that the seeds in the cupboard that were watered did germinate even though they had no light!





We also made posters to show our learning about the life cycle of a sunflower.

Next week, we are going to draft a letter to Mrs Foster in English, asking her to consider building a new garden at Priory School. We will try and convince her with our persuasive arguments and reasoning! In maths, we are going to be focused on counting pounds and pence to work out how much money there is in total. We will be looking at the difference between seeds and bulbs in science, and will be planting our own seeds to bring home and then writing up a set of instructions on how to plant a seed.

<u>Our Learning</u>

This week, we took part in some experience lessons to learn about the life of working Victorian children. In Maths, we have been exploring divisibility using our multiplication facts.

In History lessons, we have been learning about life in Ancient Egypt. We have also been learning more about coding in Computing and continuing to practise the songs we are learning for our upcoming performance of 'Disney's Finding Nemo Kids'.

Next week, we will continue to learn about life in Ancient Egypt. The children will be given the opportunity to explore an 'Egyptian tomb' and to see what artefacts can tell us about life in Ancient Egypt.

<u>Our Learning</u>

This week, we have had a busy week, the children have been working hard learning the lyrics for our performance coming up soon.

In English, the children have been planning and writing their version of the Beowulf from the perspective of Beowulf. This has given the children the opportunity to really think about what the characters are feeling.

In Maths, the children have been multiplying one-digit numbers by two or three-digit numbers. They have then been applying these skills to solve challenges.

Next week in English, the children are going to be moving on to look at a picture book, Journey which will really open up the children's imagination.

Next week in Maths, the children are going to be moving on to dividing two-digit and three-digit numbers by one digit.

In the afternoons, we are going to be moving on to learning about the history of the Anglo-Saxons. The children will be looking at artefacts and thinking about what this information tells them about what it was like at the time.

<u>Our Learning</u>

This week, we continued our Science topic focusing on Space. In particular, we explored our solar system and focused on day, night and the phases of the moon!

In maths, we continued our topic of multiplication, learnt new strategies to multiply 3 digits by 2 digits, and 4 digits by 2 digits. We have progressed onto our new topic and moved onto short division.

In English, we continued to watch One Small Stepa story about a girl called Luna – and will eventually retell this narrative in our own words.

This term in PSHRE, we will be looking at Dreams and Goals. Here we will focus on the values of hope and trust.

Next week, we will learn more about why there is life on Earth, the Goldilocks planet, and write our own space-themed versions of this fairy tale.

In maths, we will continue our topic of division, and develop strategies to divide 4 digits by 1 digit, divide with remainders and multiply unit fractions with integers.

In English, we will continue writing effective sentences, focussing on complex sentences that extend our writing. We will then retell this narrative in our own words.

Year 6 Peek at the Week Friday 24th January 2025

<u>Our Learning</u>

This week, in geography, we started our new topic on the Americas! We identified some of the countries and learnt about the wide range of climates and biomes.

In English, we drew on our knowledge of the Industrial Revolution in our poem. We understood its impact on nature and animals — including the moth.

In maths, we completed the topic of decimals by focusing on dividing decimals by integers and applying division and multiplication in context. We then began a new topic on ratios, exploring both language and symbols.

Next week, in geography, we will learn about manmade landmarks in North and South America, as well as the impact of deforestation in the Amazon rainforest.

In English, we will use our knowledge of Natural Selection to write our own narrative poem on Darwin's finches!

In maths, we will complete the topic of ratios by exploring ratios and fractions and applying ratios to worded problems. We will then begin a new topic on fractions, decimals and percentages, with a focus on converting fractions to decimals and understanding their equivalents.

PSHRE Focus: Dreams and Goals. In PSHRE this term, we will understand the difference between realistic and unrealistic goal-setting. We will be able to identify our learning strengths and the steps we need to take to achieve our goals. We will share our dreams for the world by identifying problems and discussing our concerns with other people. We will understand how to work with others to help make the world a better place. Lastly, we will be able to recognise and celebrate our own achievements when our goals are met.

What the Woodlands has been up to

This week:

In English, We visited Black Park with the children this week and took a walk around. The children had a checklist of things to find and describe, for example, spikey pinecones, a zigzag path, and rough bark. They've also been working on improving their sentences by adding adjectives and conjunctions.

In addition, the children have started planning their adapted version of Little Red Riding Hood. We are really looking forward to reading the children's completed stories.

In maths, we've continued focusing on the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. The children have been practicing sorting shapes by their properties and learning how to draw some of them.

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
To start the New Year, the Language of the Month for January is Chinese. Please see the slides below. The slides have been introduced to the children in school.

This is also a great opportunity for families to share any photos of linked celebrations. Chinese New Year is marked on the 29th January and it is the year of the snake!





Why is my child worrying?

Worries/fears are normal.

Worries come and go.

Sometimes worries can grow over time and stop your child from doing something or going somewhere.

For example, they may make your child:

- Avoid going to a park where there may be dogs that frighten them
- Avoid going upstairs on their own at home
- Avoid speaking to new people
- Have sleep difficulties
- Feel less confident in themselves, thus unable to do their best or enjoy activities

Who are we?

Mental Health Support Team (MHST) supports children and young people with emerging, mild or moderate mental health difficulties which may be affecting day to day life.

The MHST is a new initiative and the service is being offered to 14 participating schools in Slough.

We offer selected schools:

- Interventions to support children with mild to moderate mental health difficulties
- Surgeries for staff
 - Mental Health Network meetings
 - Staff training and support schools to have more of a focus on emotional wellbeing and mental health
 - Peer mentoring
 - Online access to resources and peer support on emotional wellbeing and mental health for parents/carers and professionals via digital platforms called SHaRON

Depending on the age of the child or young person, we may work either directly with them or with their parents/carers. We also work with school staff supporting them to have a greater focus on emotional health and wellbeing in the various aspects of school life.

Working together to create positive changes:

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We can think of all behaviour as a form of communication. When we hold this in mind it's important we try to understand what drives behaviour. This can often be difficult for children and young people to express or identify themselves.

Through our interventions we will work together with you to help identify needs and emotions underlying the behaviour. This greater understanding offers the opportunity to explore helpful coping strategies to create positive changes over time.

What to expect

After an initial assessment with both you and your child, we work collaboratively with you, the parent/carer, over 6-8 sessions. These sessions may consist of:

- Learning about the cause and maintenance of anxiety/behavioural difficulties in children
- Setting and working towards goals that your child would like to achieve
- Developing techniques in sessions that you can use at home when supporting your child
